Applying for a Student Visa

It is highly recommended that before coming to Turkey, you should apply for the student visa. You can apply with your "letter of acceptance" from İstanbul Medipol University and a completed visa application form. You can do it in the nearest Turkish Consulate in your country.

If your country is not exempted from visa by the Republic of Turkey, ordinary passport holders are required to have a visa to enter Turkey. However, some countries are exempted from applying for a Turkish Visa. For those who need to apply for a student visa, you need to make the online appointment via www.visa.gov.tr web address.

How to Get to Istanbul Medipol University?

As Medipol University, we have three campuses. One of them is located on the European side of the city while the other two are located at the Anatolian/Asian side. You will need to arrive at the Anatolian side.

Transportation from Sabiha Gökçen Airport (Anatolian side):

Bus: You can get on the E-3 Sabiha Gökçen-Levent subway or 122 H bus line to arrive at Kavacık. You'll get off at the station called **"Kavacık Köprüsü."** Also, you can get on the Havabus Shuttle. Please visit the link below for detailed information: https://www.havabus.com/yolcuservisi/taksim-sabihagokcenhavalimani.aspx.

Kavacık Campuses

HAVAIST buses can be used to reach the Kavacık Campuses from Istanbul Airport. You need to get the bus HVIST-9 and get off the bus at the first stop, Kavacık. The HAVAIST bus journey costs 32 TRY (please see the official website of HAVAIST to get the most up-to-date information). It takes 10 to 15 minutes to walk the campus from the stop.

Unkapanı Campus

HAVAIST buses can be used to reach the Unkapani Campus from Istanbul Airport. You need to get the bus HVIST-15 and get off the bus at the stop Aksaray. The HAVAIST bus journey costs 25 TRY (please see the official website of HAVAIST to get the most up-to-date information). Then you can take public transportation or take a taxi to reach the Unkapani Campus. It takes 6 to 10 minutes by taxi, 10 to 15 minutes by bus to get the campus. The taxi journey approximately costs 15 TRY. Bus fare is 3.5 TRY for adults, 1.7 TRY for students.

Istanbul buses are all cashless, so you need an Istanbul Card. You can use the Istanbul Card on HAVAIST buses as well. If you do not have one, you can download the HAVAIST mobile application to create an account, then top up journey credits. You cannot pay with cash on the HAVAIST buses.

How can I go from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport (European Side) by metro?

Passengers who want to go from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport by metro must go to Zincirlikuyu/Gayrettepe station first, after the completion of the ongoing Metro construction, and then from Gayrettepe Station to the M11: Gayrettepe - New Airport Metro Line and can reach the Istanbul Airport.

How can I go from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport by HAVAIST?

Passengers who want to go from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport by HAVAIST can reach Istanbul Airport by HAVAIST vehicles departing from the Kavacık Köprüsü (Kavacık Bridge) station.

How can I go from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport by taxi?

Istanbul Airport is approximately 60-65 km away from Beykoz. Passengers who want to take a taxi from Beykoz to Istanbul Airport. It costs around 150-160 Turkish Liras. This journey takes around 50-60 minutes.

Transportation in Istanbul

Istanbul, Turkey's richest province in terms of transport. Domestic and overseas transportation is the center. Introduction to one-third of the tourists visiting Turkey is Istanbul. Istanbul provided one-fifth of one-third of export and import. Road and rail hub, as well as the largest seaport and airport in Istanbul.

Local Transportation:

In addition to minibuses and buses, sea vehicles, metro, metro bus, tramway, funicular are frequently used in urban vehicles.

Residence Permit Application:

Having arrived in Turkey, and after completing your university registration, the most important thing you need to do is to apply for a residence permit.

You will be able to carry out all formal transactions as long as you stay in Turkey with your residence card and foreign identification (YU) number you receive after your application.

If your residence card does not expire, it can be used while entering or leaving Turkey, and thus you do not need to get a new visa. It is important that you renew your residence permit before the validity period expires.

You are exempt from residence application fee as a student, you are only required to pay the card fee.

Required documents:

- Application form should be printed
- Health insurance
- 4 photos
- Copy of your passport
- Copy of your current residence (if you have)
- Copy of your rental contract or dormitory paper if you stay in there
- Student certificate (from MEBIS)
- Receipt of payment

Health Insurance

The students who are the citizens of the Federal Republic of Germany, Holland, Belgium, Austria, France, Macedonia, Romania, The Czech Republic, Bosnia Herzegovina, Albania, Luxemburg, Croatia, and Serbia have to acquire a document concerning Health Insurance to carry out their insurance policy in Turkey. As for the other students whose countries are not mentioned above, they have to carry out their Health Insurance when they come to Turkey within the first three months in the institution entitled as SGK, or they can do it with private institutions as well. As International Office, we will always provide help to students in this matter about instructions and steps of the process.

High School Equivalency Certificate

- Those who study at private education institutions at the international primary and secondary educational level and at the schools opened by embassies in the country and at the primary and secondary education institutions in Turkey and abroad can apply.
- You can apply through e-equivalency module from:

The required documents for the equivalence letter applications are as follows:

- Application form (available via here)
- The original and the copies of the residence permit in Turkey or your student visa
- The original and the copy of the passport's identification page and last entrance stamp page.
- The original and the copy of the diploma and the transcripts of all years. There should be Apostille on your diploma. Otherwise, your diploma should have a stamp of either ministry of education, ministry of foreign affairs, or embassy.

Registration of Mobile Phones

If you are bringing your phone from your country, you must register your phone in 30 days after you arrive in Turkey. You must pay the determined fee (subject to change) to any tax office (vergi dairesi). With the receipt, visit one of the cell phones companies (Turkcell, Vodafone, Avea) Abone Kayıt Merkezi (consumer/subscriber centre) with your phone and passport and tell the staff that you want to register your mobile phone. Prepaid units can be bought at the consumer centre or from almost any mobile phone company shop.

Phone Registration

According to the Turkish Law, a smart phone which is bought from abroad, must be registered no matter if you are a citizen or not. Otherwise, your phone will be blocked, and you will not be able to use it in Turkish territory. You have 120 days to register your phone, but this time may vary. Therefore, we suggest you do it as soon as possible after you enter Turkey. In case you do not want to register your phone, you can buy a simple phone in Turkey and use it without registration.

However, be aware that smart-phone prices are relatively high in Turkey, so for that reason, we suggest you register your phone.

Sim cards are also available at the airports. It is advisable to get one upon arriving.

MEDIPOL AND MEBIS OPERATIONS

What is MEBIS System?

It is an information management system where you can see your grades, courses, and syllabus.

What information can I get on MEBIS?

You can choose courses, examine the courses you have taken, access the information about the exams, check your grades, request documents such as student certificate, transcript, and course contents, make payment, review the past payments and download the receipts, check your course program, participate in surveys at the end of the semester.

What should I forget my MEBIS password?

Click I forgot my password section on the MEBIS home page and reset your password. To reset your password, your e-mail address or mobile number must be registered to the MEBIS. If there is a lack of this information, you need to visit the Student Affairs Office.

What should I do if my student ID card is lost or stolen?

You can request a new student ID card by clicking the Document Request section in the MEBIS system.

How can I use my student ID card as a debit card? (Param Card)

Param Card is an electronic money account that belongs to TURK Elektronik Para Inc. Param Card which you can make a deposit is valid in regular and online shopping.

How to Request a Student Certificate?

To request/demand a Student Certificate.

- 1. After logging into MEBIS, click on the "Student" menu.
- 2. Click the "My Documents" menu from the drop-down menus.
- 3. Click on the "Add New Document Request (+)" icon on the Document Operations screen and fill in the required information on the Document Request Form. (with / without picture, Turkish / English and wet signature status should be marked)
- 4. Click on the "Save" button at the bottom of the Document Request Form and let the request reach the Student Affairs Unit.
- * For visa applications and documents that international student will request to be submitted to the Provincial Immigration Administration, the "Signed" status in the "Add New Document Request (+)" tab on the Document Operations screen must be marked.

Accommodation

Dormitories

In Kavacık Campus, there are dormitories for students. However, in Haliç Campus, currently, we do not provide it. We suggest students around dormitories at this point. The Historical Peninsula, where Halic Campus is located, can be called the region of universities because it is home to many public and private universities. For this reason, there are many private Men's and Women's Dorms around the campus.

The dorms located in the Kavacık Campus are equipped with technological infrastructure and comfortable living spaces to meet the accommodation needs in the best way.

The Men's Dorm is in the North Campus while the Women's Dorm is located on the South Campus.

Since the quotas in the dormitories of our school is limited, our International Office will directly assist you to find dormitories and other residential areas you can use in the surrounding area.

Facilities of the Women's Dorm;

Room Types: There are triple and quad rooms.

The quad rooms have bunk beds, and the triple rooms have bedsteads.

There are desks, bookshelves, and lockers for each student as well as encrypted wardrobes in the rooms.

The rooms have a shower, WC, and a mini fridge. Wi-Fi service is provided. The dormitory has its refectory, mini kitchen, fitness center and cafeteria. There are rooms located on the ground floor to study courses.

Facilities of the Men's Dorm;

Room Types: There are single and triple rooms. There are desks, bookshelves, and lockers for each student as well as encrypted wardrobes in the rooms. The rooms have a shower, WC, and a mini- fridge. The dormitory has its fitness center.

Banks & ATMs

There are ATMs of Ziraat Bank and Akbank as well as Halkbank, which Medipol has an agreement on our campuses. ATMs provide all banking services 24/7. Supposeyou use a bank in Turkey to use your own country. Before coming to Turkey, you are required to meet your bank. The bank working hours are 8:30 - 17:30. All banks offer banking and mobile application services online.

Opening a bank account in Turkey

Each bank will have a slightly different process for account opening, but you can expect to be asked for the following:

o Valid Passport

o Residence Permit or Tax Identification Number. (You will get this from the Finance and Tax Office)

o Proof of address in Istanbul (For dormitory residents, it is possible to geta document from the dorm administration). Proof of address in the home country If you are staying in the dorms, the tax identification number can be counted instead of the residence permit. Otherwise, you must wait until you get your residence permit and foreign ID number. The larger retail banks in Turkey have good websites with English translations. Check out your chosen bank's site, so you're confident of the documents you'll need to take with you to the branch.

Almost all banks in Turkey have high-quality internet and mobile banking options. It may be a good idea to check which Turkish banks have branches in your home country. This may help you to make transactions between you and your family easily. Visa and Mastercard are the most common cards. The use of American Express is very limited. In Turkey (and in Istanbul and at MEDIPOL), you can use your major credit card to pay for most purchases. You can even use your credit card in many vending machines. Turkey uses the European credit card system whereby you are required to use a PIN (Personal Identification Number) when making changes.

Turkey's national currency is the Turkish lira, of which the sign is \mathfrak{t} , and the abbreviation is TRY. Note denominations include 200, 100, 50, 20, 10 and 5 liras. Coins called Kuruş to come in the form of 1, 5, 10, 25 and 50. There is the 1 Turkish lira that is also a coin. If you withdraw money from the ATM in Turkey, you will get the exchange rate used by your bank at that time. However, if you are carrying cash,

only exchange a small amount in your home country to get you through the first few days. The reason is that you will get a better exchange rate using Turkish banks or commission shops in Turkey. (You need to present identification such as your passport.) Never change money at the airport or in hotels because they rarely offer good deals.
